Trace amounts of bacterial canker in 3 out of 13 years

Noted cold damage: Low to moderate incidence in 3 years and high incidence in 1 out of 14 years

Summary remarks: Dark red to mahogany, round fruit, large in size, good flavor, and mid to late season ripening time. Fruit are borne in loose clusters and have average susceptibility to rain-induced cracking. Self-fertile, with a mid bloom season.
